

Growing Stewards

The vision statement at Carmel UMC states that we "Connect, Grow and Serve" ...as followers of Jesus Christ. I know that sometimes I replace the word "followers" with the word "disciples" not because I intend to make a mistake but for me those words are synonymous and, I do so without thinking. Being followers or disciples of Jesus Christ indicates that we are continually being transformed to be more like Jesus.

How do we do this?

We often use the word "disciplines" which for some reason carries a negative connotation and is ironic for a word that really promises so much hope and possibility. When we practice one of the disciplines of the Christian faith such as reading Scripture, serving others, praying, the transformation in our lives is visible. Another discipline, the way that we understand our money and possessions and use them, indicates the place of our heart and our relationship with Jesus. When we step up our giving we are showing fruit of our growing faith.

The stewardship campaign theme this year is "Growing Stewards". When we are growing stewards, we are bearing more and more fruit, indicating Christ growing in our hearts. I have watched a tree in my backyard this summer which is clearly dying. The only reason I have not removed it yet is because it is where I hang my bird feeders so I will leave it there until

the spring. I know my tree has died. It was not getting adequate nutrition or water from the ground and there was damage to the trunk interrupting the flow of the life giving nutrients it needed to live. Therefore no fruit, no leaves.

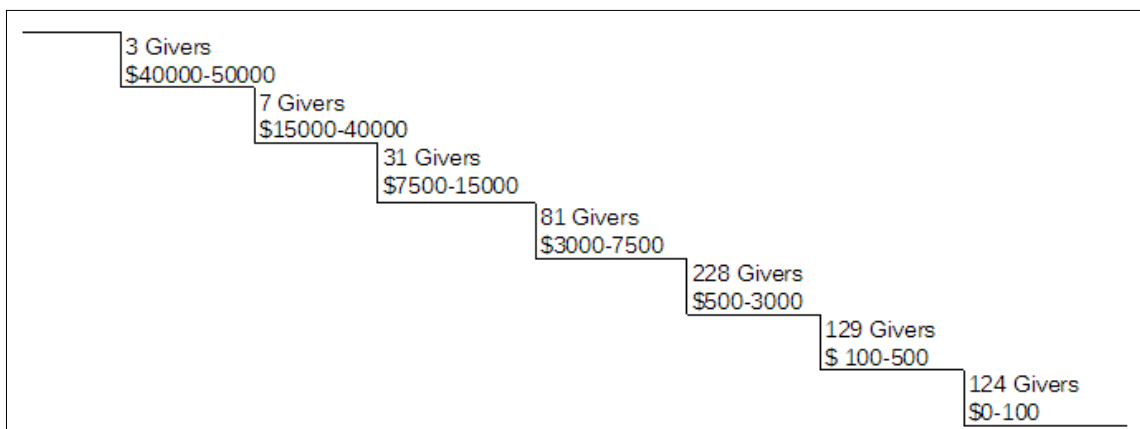

My hope is that each of you is growing in your discipleship reflected in your relationship with money and possessions.

TRUSTEES & GOVERNING COUNCIL UPDATE

The Carmel UMC Trustees and Governing Council are pleased to share an update regarding the lightning strike that damaged the air conditioning condensing units in The Youth Hub and the Main Sanctuary of the Church. The replacement projects have been completed. These units included a single 20 ton unit and a single 25 ton unit that cooled a large part of our building; both units were deemed a total loss resulting from a storm on June 24.

Carmel UMC is covered by various types of insurance from liability, accident, and machinery; like our boilers and air condensers. The coverage Carmel UMC has however does not cover all problems we might experience, but we do have a broad range of coverage for this type of event. The insurance claims department was contacted and confirmed that the event on June 24th would be covered by the existing insurance policy. All costs to replace the units, cost incurred for the temporary HVAC, were covered in full, excluding a \$2,500 deductible. Below is the financial break down of the project's expenses:

HVAC – Sanctuary and The Youth Hub

Replacement Cost Hub Unit	\$11,287.00
Temporary HVAC/Power Supply	<u>\$ 8,077.00</u>
Payment Amount	\$52,000.50

Imagine going to one of the nation's top youth events with one your friends and then getting lost in the crowd. You're by yourself as thousands of others your age pass by you, and you don't know where to go.

Scouting Chaplain Saving the Day

Kenneth Steppe, a Jamboree chaplain for the National Scout Jamboree 2017, had such an experience helping a lost Scout at this year's Jamboree.

"The first boy I ran across was clearly not having a good day. He was sitting on a bench, which was unusual because there were thousands of kids passing back and forth. I sat down, chatted with him and found out he had lost his buddy and wasn't having any fun; so, I got him to whitewater rafting in time. I also found out he had been away from his faith and his church for a long time. We talked about his faith, and because of my interfaith background I was able to talk to him in doctrinal terms and got him directed to ongoing sub-camp worship services available here."

The Role of a Scouting Chaplain

Per the [BSA website](http://BSA_website), Scouting chaplains like Steppe, not only help Scouts in need, but they also help add a spiritual tone to troop meetings and campouts. Additionally, Scouting chaplains can provide spiritual counsel when requested or needed.

When describing his role helping struggling boys at National Jamboree, Jeff Fisher, another 2017

Jamboree chaplain said this, "Listen, mostly what we do is listen and try not to render judgments, but just listen."

Scouting Chaplains Helping at Jamboree

Each year over a dozen chaplains, like Steppe and Fisher, volunteer their services to the National Scout Jamboree in West Virginia. Chaplains represent a variety of different faiths but do not proselytize.

Instead, they are there to be friends to Scouts and leaders, and to encourage both groups in their Scouting endeavors. Chaplains can also help Scouts develop their relationship with God through interfaith meetings.

Whether it's to be a friend, help a lost Scout rekindle his faith, or even just listen, Scouting chaplains exemplify the Scout motto to "be prepared." And although they might not wear capes, they are superheroes ready and willing to serve those in need.

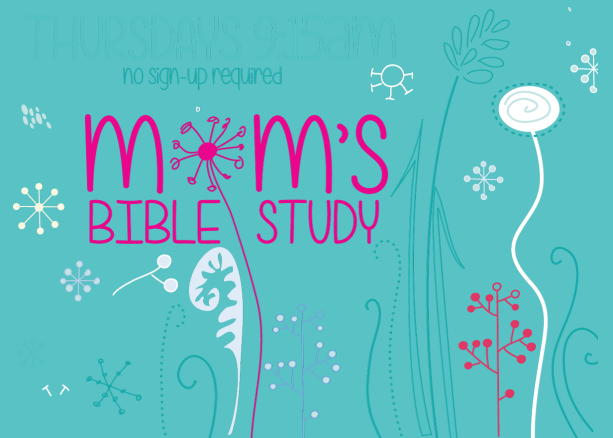


Red Ribbon Sunday

“Experiencing the Miraculous Amidst the Mundane!”

**Adult Discipleship
Rev. Dr. Brian Shoemaker**

Spiritual retreats into the pristine solitude of the woods can be invigorating. Somehow as we move away from the mundane regularities of our lives to intentionally bask in communion with Something More, we often discover a renewed momentum for living!

As I consider those moments of spiritual renewal, I also realize that the most profound experiences on retreat involved other persons of faith. Early in my life, I realized that true spiritual renewal seldom happens without being in community with others. In fact, experiencing life to the fullest never happens outside of meaningful relationships. Perhaps God put that in our DNA?

The scripture is clear. God’s intention for us is clear. In order for us to live well, it is essential that we are connected in community. We were created to live within the fold of a loving community. This includes a family of faith- with folks who are like-minded persons...with people who love God, are called according to His purposes in this world, and encourage us (no matter from how far away we might have drifted) to find our way home.

In his book, *“Bowling Alone: The Collapse and Revival of American Community,”* Harvard University Professor of Public Policy, Robert Putnam discerned that “the greatest epidemic in public life is loneliness.” We exist in a culture of the self-absorbed, alienated from meaningful relationships - and we have become a population of “doing,” with little quality for just being - and being with other human beings.

Biblically speaking, it is still *“...not good that humanity should be alone...”* (Genesis 2:8) *We are created for community and for “growing in the grace and knowledge of the Lord.”* (II Peter 3:18) We simply cannot grow well as spectators - existing outside of community!

Why are spiritually-intimate gatherings of persons

important? Because we experience the Presence of God through persons in whom God lives. Imagine how our loving God emerges from a gathering of those who are gathered in His name - truly being together as one! *“Where they are two or three gathered together in His name, He is in the midst.”* (Matthew 18:20) When persons of faith gather together to feast on fellowship with one another, the presence of God Himself resides at the head of our table.

Participating in a Grow Group, a Sunday School Class, or a Discipleship Course, or simply sharing a meal with one another, is essential to our spiritual well-being. It is also the way through which we follow our Lord’s admonition to learn to *“love one another.”*

So, share your life journey with others. Let them share their journey with you. Join or start a Grow Group - be an active participant in a discipleship course or Sunday morning class. Claim your own sacred space in a home or a church classroom, a coffee shop, or a park! Learn to love persons in the Presence of the One who will meet you there. Life in Christ is a memorable journey when we share His love with others.

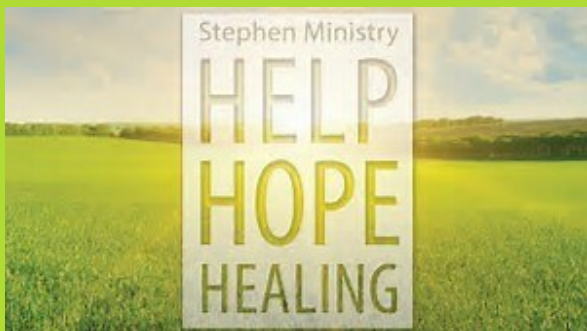
