

New Beginnings Make New Endings

I recently saw a quote that I just love, "No one can go back and start a new beginning, but anyone can start today and make a new ending" (Maria Robinson).

Each new year I make a list of personal and professional goals which are new beginnings hopefully making new endings...endings of growth and improvement. I pray about what the Lord wants to do in my life and how I can work with Him to grow in that area. Honestly, that list can be very, very long. But if I were to write a statement that summarizes all of them, it would be that I want more than anything, to be the kind of person who lives to be devoted to Christ with all my heart.

I feel that this is supported in Scripture:

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here."
2 Corinthians 5:17

In Howard Baker's book, *The One Thing*, he shows three Bible heroes who inspire us to live focused on one thing:

- David: In the midst of his painful and frightening desert trials over about ten years in which he was horribly mistreated and nearly killed he prayed, "One thing I ask, this is what I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life... My heart says of you, 'Seek his face!'" (Psalm 27:4, 8).
- Mary: She set aside her kitchen work to sit at Jesus' feet and listen to him and she received his affirmation: "There are many things that can be worried about, but only one thing is needed – it is the best thing – and Mary has chosen it!" (Luke 10:41-42, my paraphrase).
- Paul: He counted his many accomplishments and blessings as dung compared to the "surpassing greatness of knowing Christ" (Philippians 3:8, KJV). He expressed his life ambition, "One thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:13-14).

I also believe that the *one thing* is called Discipleship. I certainly hope that each year of my life reflects growing discipleship and this is also my desire for Carmel UMC each year.

- How do we grow to be devoted to Christ as our *One Thing*?
- How do we make real changes to how we live our daily lives as an expression of love for God?
- How do we overcome worry or anger?
- How do we learn to rejoice in trials?
- How do we pray without ceasing?
- How do we love difficult people?


The way to make a real character change – to learn, grow, or heal in any area – is by intentional effort. Many of us meet with personal and professional coaches but why wouldn't we look to Jesus as our Coach and "work out" with him. "Train yourself to be godly" Paul advises us (1 Timothy 4:7).

As the Carmel UMC Pastoral team plans ministries for CUMC in 2018, we are prioritizing all that we will be doing to live out the Carmel UMC vision statement so that all are "Connecting, Growing, and Serving as disciples of Jesus Christ". ***This one thing is called discipleship.***

I hope that throughout 2018 you'll open your heart and mind in search of God's direction for the one thing He desires and designs for you to grow in your discipleship.

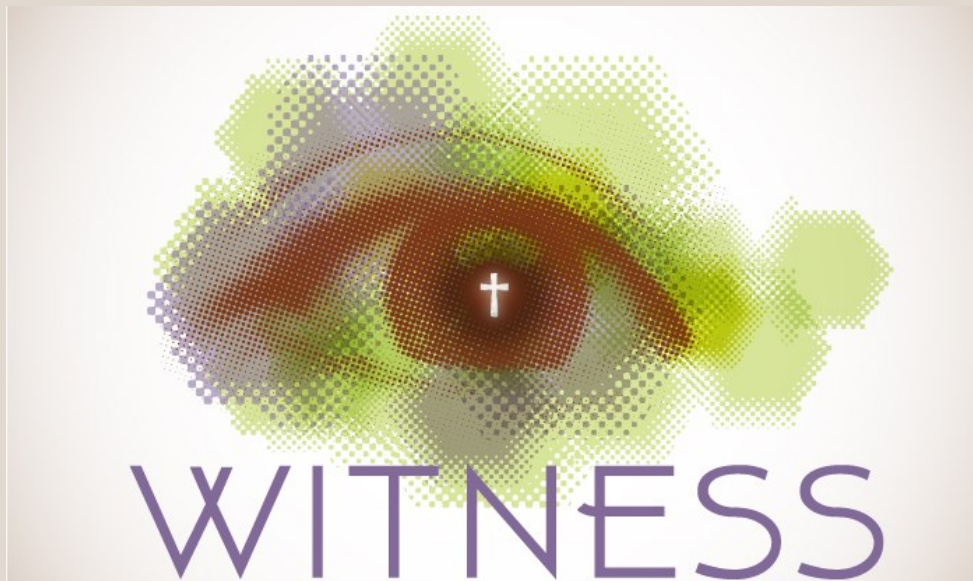

"Our Fletcher Place visit on 12/22/17 enabled us to link up with 2 men that are battling alcohol issues and one requested a special " 12 step recovery Bible". Upon hearing this the other man (who had never heard of that specific Bible) requested one as well. These Bibles will be delivered to both men on Friday, December 29th when we go back down again to serve at Fletcher Place. These gentlemen are trying to help themselves. Please pray for them."

:There was a woman we encountered a couple of months ago that left a dangerous environment and moved herself into an apartment with nothing - no bed, no food, no furniture and no television. We were able to help her by providing these things assure her that she mattered. She was very fearful around others but has since been able to make some friends in her apartment building. Praise be to the Lord."

"Our church was able to reach out to a single mom with 3 boys who had car issues with their only car which prevented her from getting out to food pantries, to medical appointments, and to the pharmacy. We were able to get repairs done and restore their car for them. Praise be the Lord."

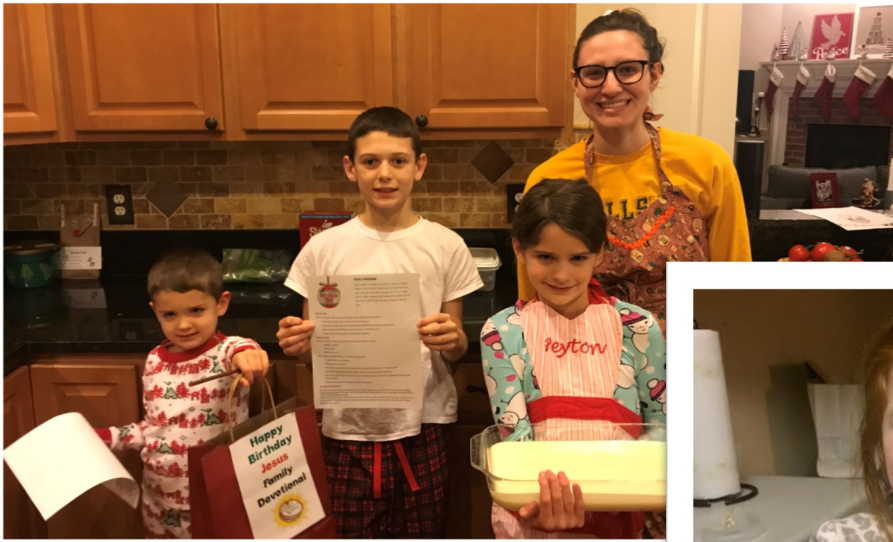
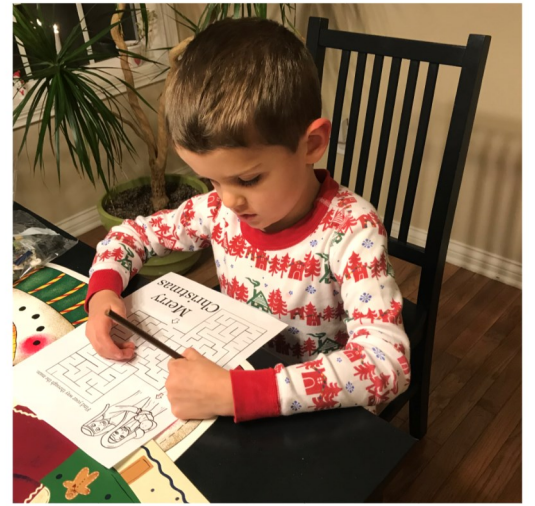

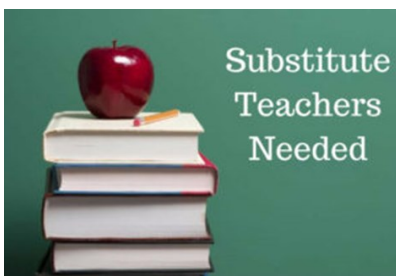
