4. Prayers and more prayers have been shared and Leadership is working on the early connections to support Rev. Adriane.


But what can the Body, the church, do to make a difference? Here are some suggestions:

ENDOWMENTS & PLANNED GIVING

CUMC Endowment Fund Annual Report for 2017

The primary purpose of the Endowment Fund is to provide a means for members and friends of the Church to make gifts and bequests to provide a permanent endowment of financial support and living memorials.

CUMC Endowment Fund Performance – 2017

The annual results were particularly strong in 2017 and are summarized below.

- Investments in the Multiple Asset Fund (65% equity/35% fixed income) generated a gross return of 17.98% vs. the benchmark's return of 13.39%.
- Fees for all accounts averaged 0.70%
- The 2017 rate of inflation (CPI) was 2.1%.
- The CUMC Endowment Fund (<u>excluding</u> the Greenburg fund) grew by \$121.7K and a net of \$82.4K after distributions and fees
 - * Ending total is \$792.5K
 - * Distributions were \$34.3K
 - * Fees were \$5.1K
 - Rushlight Fund (unrestricted gift account) exceeded \$500K (e.g. \$516K); first time since prior to 2011
- The Greenburg Fund (restricted to named Missions) grew by \$106.7K and a net of \$71.6K after total distributions and total fees.

Distribution Rates and Amounts

The CUMC Endowment Fund distribution rate (percent taken from each account) for 2017 was **5.0%**. This resulted in the following distribution payouts.

The 2017 total distribution of \$64,800 compares to the 2016 total of \$63,200.

Significant Gifts in 2017

A gift of \$25,000 was received to establish a new Endowment Fund account "designated" for Preschool Scholarships for families with a financial need and (ii) a priority for ESL children.




Who is up for softball?


One of the most important theologians of the twentieth century illuminates the relationship between ourselves and the teachings of Jesus

What can the call to discipleship, the adherence to the word of Jesus, mean today to the businessman, the soldier, the laborer, or the aristocrat? What did Jesus

mean to say to us? What is his will for us today? Drawing on the Sermon on the Mount, Dietrich Bonhoeffer answers these timeless questions by providing a seminal reading of the dichotomy between "cheap grace" and "costly grace." "Cheap grace," Bonhoeffer wrote, "is the grace we bestow on ourselves...grace without discipleship....Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again, the girl which must be asked for, the door at which a man must know....It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life."

The Cost of Discipleship is a compelling statement of the demands of sacrifice and ethical consistency from a man whose life and thought were exemplary articulations of a new type of leadership inspired by the Gospel, and imbued with the spirit of Christian humanism and a creative sense of civic duty.


