

#### Dear Carmel UMC,

I want to say thank you for 13 amazing years! I know it's a cliché, but time really does fly. I can't believe I have been on staff and a part of this church for more years than I attended public school! I remember those early days with the youth ministry (I was hired as full time youth pastor) fondly and vividly. I spent my first week on a mission trip to Des Moines, Iowa and it was quite memorable (riding on a firetruck, going to Adventureland...) and that was just the start. Over the years I have been on dozens of retreats and mission trips including 7 international mission trips to Mexico (twice), Guatemala, and El Salvador (four times) and have had hundreds of students attend these events, as well as weekly programs at the church and in our community. In recent years I was asked to step in and take over the Contemporary Service (formerly called The Stream) on an interim basis...and I've been doing it ever since. I have the honor of preaching most weeks and sharing God's word with this church. I have been blessed to work under two amazing Senior Pastors (Greg and Patti) and with some incredible staff members who I now consider dear friends and mentors.

This church has become my family's church home. Our kids have been raised in the incredible Children's Ministry under the care of Ginny Allison and Aj Mildenberg and my wife and I have been blessed to be a part of an awesome small group full of people we love dearly! We have always felt loved and known at Carmel UMC and we are so grateful.

My final words of encouragement to you would be to keep seeking Jesus with all your heart. We have a huge task in front of us (to reach the world with

the good news of Jesus) and my prayers will be with you as you seek to connect with God and others, grow in your faith and serve as the hands and feet of Jesus Christ.

And let us remember these words from Hebrews 12 "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eves on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow wearv and lose heart."



June 7-9 was the annual gathering of lay persons and clergy to worship together and to do the business of the church. From the message by Bishop Julius Trimble, and through times of worship, there were constant reminders for the church to be united and focused on our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for transformation of the world.

It was an honor as committees made their reports to see our own congregation's participation. Nancy Leonard and Karen Gould both served as trustees for the conference. Also present were the two representatives from Carmel UMC, Nolan and Carol Barrios. If you have any questions, they would love to speak with you.

Though there were no outright discussions or demonstrations, one could feel the undertow of the issues of LGBTQ as we approach the special General Conference of 2019 to address the church's position.

Here are a few of the resolutions which passed:

• It was resolved that we live by our social

principle that we deplore acts of hate or violence against any group or person based on race, color, national origin, ethnicity, age, gender, disability, status, economic condition, sexual orientation, gender identity or religious affiliation.

- It was resolved that we would work to eliminate racism and violence directed toward newly arriving migrants from all parts of the world, as well as those who have lived and worked among us for some time, and that we express our opposition to any policy that breaks apart families and excludes refugees solely on the basis of their religion or national origin.
- It was resolved that a letter of invitation be sent to Wesley Seminary to begin dialogue about Wesley Seminary becoming an approved seminary for training United Methodist candidates in ministry.

As we now move closer to the May 2019 special General Conference, which is solely focused on issues of LGBTQ, I will keep you apprised of any action taken. If you currently desire to have your own personal voice be heard, you may go the UMC website at <u>umc.org</u> and submit a petition. Most of all, I ask that we unite our hearts in prayer that God's will be done throughout this process and through the decision made.


