

#### **ORDERS WITHIN THE UMC**

This past month, Carmel UMC welcomed two new pastors to our staff: Rev. Adriane Curtis and Rev. Jill Buckler. Both of these pastors were appointed positions by the United Methodist Conference. In an attempt to clarify to the congregation these "titles", we've come up with some proactive answers to possible questions.

## What Order do they serve within the United Methodist Church?

- Adrian and Patti are *Elders*
- Jill is a Deacon

#### Who do they serve?

- Adrian and Patti's appointment is to Carmel UMC to serve our congregation
- Jill's primary appointment is as a counselor serving our district (replacing Jackie Chandler in that role)

All three are on staff at Carmel UMC, but only Patti and Adrian are employees of our Church.

#### Order of Deacon and Order of Elder Similarities

The candidacy process is the *SAME* for both Orders.

- Elders and Deacons both interview with the Board of Ordained Ministry to be Commissioned.
- Once Commissioned, candidates:
  - are granted PROVISIONAL conference membership
  - become Residents in Ministry, and meet together in cluster groups
  - become eligible after two (2) years to be considered for election to FULL conference membership, and Ordination

The Order of Elder and the Order of Deacon are parallel in status, as both are considered residents during the period of PROVISIONAL membership. Ordained Elders and Ordained Deacons are members of the annual conference, rather than members of a local church.

## Order of Deacon and Order of Elder Differences

The Order of Elder and the Order of Deacon differ in function. To borrow from medical terminology, Elders are generalists, while Deacons are specialists.

- Elders are Ordained to:
  - Order an administration role
  - Sacrament a priestly role
  - Word a teaching/preaching role
  - Service
- Deacons are Ordained to:
  - Word a teaching/preaching role
  - Service especially called to the marginalized
  - Compassion
  - Justice
  - Minister in some particular area of expertise that serves to connect the congregation with the needs of the world. Jill's expertise is in counseling.

Ordained Elders are itinerant.

• Currently with guaranteed appointment.

Deacons find their own placement, and then request the bishop's approval and appointment to that placement.

If the placement is outside the local church, the bishop also grants the Deacon a secondary appointment to a local church. Jill's appointment is to serve as a counselor. Carmel UMC has provided her with an office to provide her services. She chose to move her Church Home for her and her family to Carmel UMC. Therefore, she had to gain her secondary appointment to Carmel UMC.

Ordained Deacons cannot administer the sacraments unless given specific, special permission by the bishop, at the request of the Deacon's district superintendent. Jill has received the special permission.



Sometime on Saturday, July, 28 a hate message was painted on the shed surrounding garbage containers at Shaarey Tefilla Synagogue on 116th Street in Carmel. When I first read the reports I felt 2. Talk about this act and express "no more"! emotions from anger to sadness that this had happened in our community.

I was glad to be able to attend a community event at the synagogue where I joined around 1000 persons of varying faith backgrounds who gathered in unity to support the Jewish community following this horrific act. Driving there, I was wondering if I would want to see the damage but I found myself realizing that there was no need to see it with my own eyes as what I saw and felt from this gathering far exceeded the impact of any hatred that had been painted on their building.

Multiple persons spoke to the gathered group following opening remarks by Rabbi Benjamin

Sendrow and Mayor Jim Brainard. The speakers who followed represented many faith communities expressing support for the Jewish community and absolute intolerance for that act and any other act of hatred, discrimination and bullying. As I looked around the room, my eyes saw persons of many differing faiths, cultures and races. But it was my heart that was impacted and renewed as the love and support that was present in that room was palpable. Standing room only for over an hour...what does that express? What was the call to action?

- 1. Hang an American flag outside your home as a sign of solidarity and recognition that as Americans we have been blessed with freedom of religion.
- 3. Pray with thanks that we know that though this was an act of evil, our prayers and acts of love far outweigh any evil.

I was proud to have several staff members of the church present as well as members of CUMC. We may be communities of differing faiths but the call to love one another is our call as Christians.



#### **DISCIPLE I CLASS**

DISCIPLE is a program of disciplined Bible study aimed at developing strong Christian leaders.

The study gives the Old and New Testaments equal time, emphasizing the wholeness of the Bible as a revelation of God. DISCIPLE draws upon the work of scholars, the personal Bible reading and study of the participant, and dynamic group discussion to aid understanding of the Bible.


This first study in the program is DISCIPLE: BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY, a thirtyfour week overview of the entire Bible. Three and one-half to four hours of independent study each week is required in preparation for weekly group meetings. While this may seem like a lot, you can ask individuals who have been through this series about the life change they have experienced because of it.

Registration for the class is \$40 per person (this includes your student book as well as the class) and will open on August 5th. Classes are led by Janet Boyd on Tuesday evenings starting September 18th. #### DISCIPLE II CLASS

Disciple: Into the Word Into the World is the second study in the four-phase Disciple program and is prepared for those who are graduates of Disciple: Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study. This study proclaims the transforming power of Scripture while teaching Bible study skills that take participants deeper into the Scripture. The importance of keeping Bible study related to witness is reinforced while participants are encouraged to practice spiritual disciplines arising out of Scripture for the purpose of changing habits and transforming lives.

The study also emphasizes the rhythm of coming to God and going for God, of being in the Word and in the world individually and corporately. This study understands the growing Christian as under discipline in community and in ministry to the world. Disciple: Into the Word Into the World approaches all experiences of life as opportunities for faithful witness and service. This 32 week class requires participants to have completed Disciple I and will be facilitated by Bill Leonard every Monday night starting Monday, September 17th. The cost of this course, which includes the student manual and the class, is \$40.00. Registration for this course will be open starting Sunday, August 5th. 

## September 23: 3 year old and 3rd grade Bible programs!

3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Bible program.

Each year during September, we begin a short class about the Bible for our third graders **and their parents** (if your kids are 4th graders and you are new to Carmel UMC please consider joining us) for the Bible class on September 23 at the Sunday School hour, following the children's moment. Following the class, your child will be presented with a new Bible at either the service in the Sanctuary or the FLC.

This Bible was especially chosen so that your kids may use it in pre-confirmation in 4th and 5th grades as well as during Confirmation(6th grade). You and your child must attend the class to receive the Bible. Please let Pastor Aj know if you and your child will be participating so that enough Bibles and materials are purchased.

This year we are adding a Bible class and presentation to



children in the 3 year old program! (Children must be 3 by August 1, 2018) This class for you and your child will be at 10am on Sunday, September 23 and then the presentation of the Bibles will be at the 10:45am service, the same day. This Bible, *The Jesus Storybook Bible* tells the story beneath all the stories in the Bible. At the center of all is a baby, the child upon whom everything will depend. From Noah, to Moses, to the great King David---every story points to Him. He is the missing piece to the puzzle---the piece that makes all the other pieces fit together. From the Old Testament through the New Testament, as the story unfolds, children will pick up the clues and piece together the puzzle. The principle is held in perpetuity, while a perfecentage of the investment income is paid out each year.


