

So many things are happening, it feels like one of the worst times to be away on vacation.

In America, we measure our time out carefully. "Daylight Savings Time" still baffles me. I definitely do not save any time changing my clocks twice a year. We are obsessed with trying to turn back the clock and fight the passage of time. How often have you wished there were more hours in the day? Yet, in Ecclesiastes, time is portrayed as a series of events that ebb and flow within seasons of our lives in great abundance. There is time for EVERYTHING. Time is not something to be captured or fought. No need for more time, because we already have more than enough for the necessary things of life.

If we wanted to get closer to the sense of time reflected in Ecclesiastes, we could hop the Atlantic to the continent of Africa. John Mbiti is a noted African Theologian who wrote on "The Concept of Time." He says that in Africa, time is seen as a series of events that have taken place, or are currently happening, rather than numerical dates. He argues that numerical calendars are "both impossible and meaningless in traditional life."[1] There is always enough time for the necessary things of life.

What truly matters? I could also ask, where do we

spend our time and money? Take a look at your calendar, or your budget. Are you spending your time and money on the things that matter most to you? Rather than needing more time or money, God may be calling us to set better priorities. Could we be wasting time and money on the things that don't matter, while we sacrifice the things that do matter? In the list of priorities that are reflected in our budget and schedule, where does God rank? These are questions I continue to struggle to answer. Sometimes I get it right, and sometimes I get it wrong.

We all have an opportunity to consider our priorities for giving in the weeks ahead at Carmel United Methodist Church. I hope you will all join me in prayer about where God is calling us to prioritize spending our time and money. If you haven't gotten your devotional book, please pick one up outside the sanctuary or the family life center. We have an amazing God of abundance who loves us relentlessly. God wants to give us the full range of life, with every glorious season. May we all have God's vision to set priorities. May we be generous with the time and money entrusted to us, because we have a God who has been abundantly generous to us. May you, and your family, experience God's deep abundance in the coming month.



This course compares two letters which address a nearly identical issue: what to do about a runaway servant. Prof. N.T. Wright unpacks Paul's letter to Philemon, which addresses concerns about the 'runaway' named Onesimus. Prof. Wright then explains the situation and setting surrounding the letter of Pliny the Younger to Sabinianus about an unnamed runaway. The social structures endemic to Rome become visible and understandable in such a way to see how Paul's new way of life was meant to confront social norms.




Moms Bible Study


