## **Answering the Call**

Often in sermons I talk about how God calls us to ministry, how that ministry will often stretch us and will require commitment, and that no matter the call, God always equips us. I am excited to share with you two of our staff members who have recently responded to a call of God for their lives.

Chris Thornsberry, Minister of Adult Discipleship, and Matt Sherrill, Minister of Youth, have both begun following a call to ordination as Deacon in the UMC. The UMC ordains persons to one of two orders.

Deacon--The Deacon's call is to a lifetime of servanthood and therefore has opportunities to serve beyond a local church. Currently serving at CUMC is Rev. Jill Buckler, an ordained deacon whose call is to Christian counseling. Both Chris and Matt will live out their call through their current ministry areas. Deacons are not itinerant so they are not moved by the Bishop. Deacons must find their own places to serve. Deacons are not called sacramentally so they do not baptize nor bless communion, though they may support an elder in both. "The Deacon has made a faithful response of the mission of the Church, meeting the emerging needs of the future" (Book of Discipline, page 246).

Elder--The Elder's call is to a lifetime commitment to the Word, Sacrament, Order and Service. They are authorized to preach, teach, provide pastoral care, to administer sacraments of baptism and Holy Communion. The Elder is itinerant and under the appointment system so is appointed and moved according to Bishop's decisions. Congratulate and be a supporter and encourager of both Chris and Matt as they complete a master's degree and enter into the candidacy process. Also keep them in your prayers.




**Births...**Grace Catherine Holden was born January 18th to Trey and Lauren Holden. She was welcomed by brothers Andrew and Jack.

What is being presented for a vote is basically three plans or choices which have been titled The One Church Plan, the Connectional Plan and the Traditional Plan. You may read more about

I will also be holding two sessions at the church as a time for clarification about the plans and discussion of what this means for the local church.

February 6th at 1:00pm & 6:00pm


The sessions are not intended to be a theological exploration of the sexuality issues but instead consideration of how the church may remain united despite differences.






# "IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF JESUS" ISRAEL TRIP INFORMATION SESSION


Sunday, February 24th ● 10-10:20am ● Library/ Conference Rm



#### STUDY THE GOSPEL OF MARK

Every Thursday ● 9:15-10:30AM ● Rm LL12


In the Gospel of Mark, author and speaker Francis Chan invites us to walk with him along the ancient ways of the Master. Tracing the steps of Jesus and the Twelve through Israel, Francis explores the major themes of the Gospel of Mark, and asks: Are we willing to take this journey to embrace discipleship? Childcare provided.





The 170th Anniversary Campaign raised \$76,700 including matching gifts. Our goal of using all the matching funds was achieved. The three focus funds together doubled in size. The Music Fund grew by almost five-fold from \$7,300 to \$34,700. The Mike Miller preschool Scholarship Fund almost doubled growing from \$26,500 to \$49,400 and the Maintenance Fund grew by 63% from \$40,100 to \$65,400. These gifts are very meaningful and will have a welcomed impact on the three ministries.

Seventeen additional engraved golden leaves will be placed on the Endowment Tree recognizing gifts to the Endowment. The Campaign was a resounding success exceeding all of the Endowment Committee's expectations. We are grateful for the generosity of those who made gifts to the Endowment Fund.
